## Conflict Minerals Statement

In July of 2010, the United States Congress passed the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (Wall Street Reform Act) which includes legislation (section 1502) mandating supply chain due diligence and requiring U.S. publicly traded companies to report the use of “Conflict Materials” in the manufacture of their products. The specific metals in question referred to a 3TG: Gold (Au), Tantalum (Ta), Tin (Sn) and Tungsten (W)

### Titanium Industries Conflict Minerals Statement

Titanium and Titanium alloys 6Al-4V, 6Al-4V ELI, 3Al-2.5V, 13V-11Cr-3Al, 3Al-8V-6Cr-4Mo-4Zr do not contain Conflict Materials.

Titanium alloys 6Al-6V-2Sn, 6Al-2Sn-4Zr-2Mo contain small quantities of Tin (2%) that can be from recycled scrap that cannot be traced to the original source of supply.

Nickel Base alloys 625 and 718 contain conflict materials that can be from recycled scrap that cannot be traced to the original source of supply.  
Alloy 625 (Tantalum) Alloy 718 (Tantalum)

Wrought Cobalt- Chromium- Molybdenum Alloys for surgical implants do not contain conflict materials.

Recycled Materials (scrap) - If a company’s conflict minerals are derived from recycled or scrap sources rather than mined sources, the company’s products containing such minerals are considered “DRC conflict free”
